General objectives

- swiftly shift to low-carbon economies in developed countries
- support developing countries to build and restructure their energy systems in a climate friendly way, by promoting a supportive policy environment and technology transfer
- increase global justice, adaptation to climate change and the protection of biodiversity is key



Financial needs for internat. climate protection measures

- Following the IPCC reports (2007) additional investment and financial flows will be needed in 2030
 - amounting up to 200–210 billion US \$ to return global GHG emissions to current levels
 - amounting up to several tens of billion US \$ for adaptation



Auctioning emission allowances

- Germany auctions nearly 10 % of the allowances from the European emissions trading (2008-2012)
- 400 million € of the revenues are used annually to finance climate protection actions both on domestic and on international level
- 120 million € are used for the international part in developing countries and economies in transition (in 2008)



Objectives of the International Climate Protection Initiative

- Effective contribution to emissions reduction and adaptation to climate change
- Protection of climate-relevant biodiversity
- Promoting development of innovative and replicable projects
- Demonstrating that climate protection is possible and has economic effects
- Paving the way for a post-2012 climate regime through targeted cooperation with emerging, developing and transition countries



Criteria of the International Climate Protection Initiative

- Mitigation effect
- Demand orientation and anchoring in partner countries national strategies
- Innovative character (viable new technological, economic, social or institutional approaches)
- Multiplier effect: Model role for the development of a low-carbon economy and/or adaptation to climate change
- Support provided by partners / mobilisation of private capital or contribution by project participants in the partner countries
- Building on the strengths of German climate policy
- Synergies with the conservation of other environmental goods
- Eligibility as official development assistance (ODA)



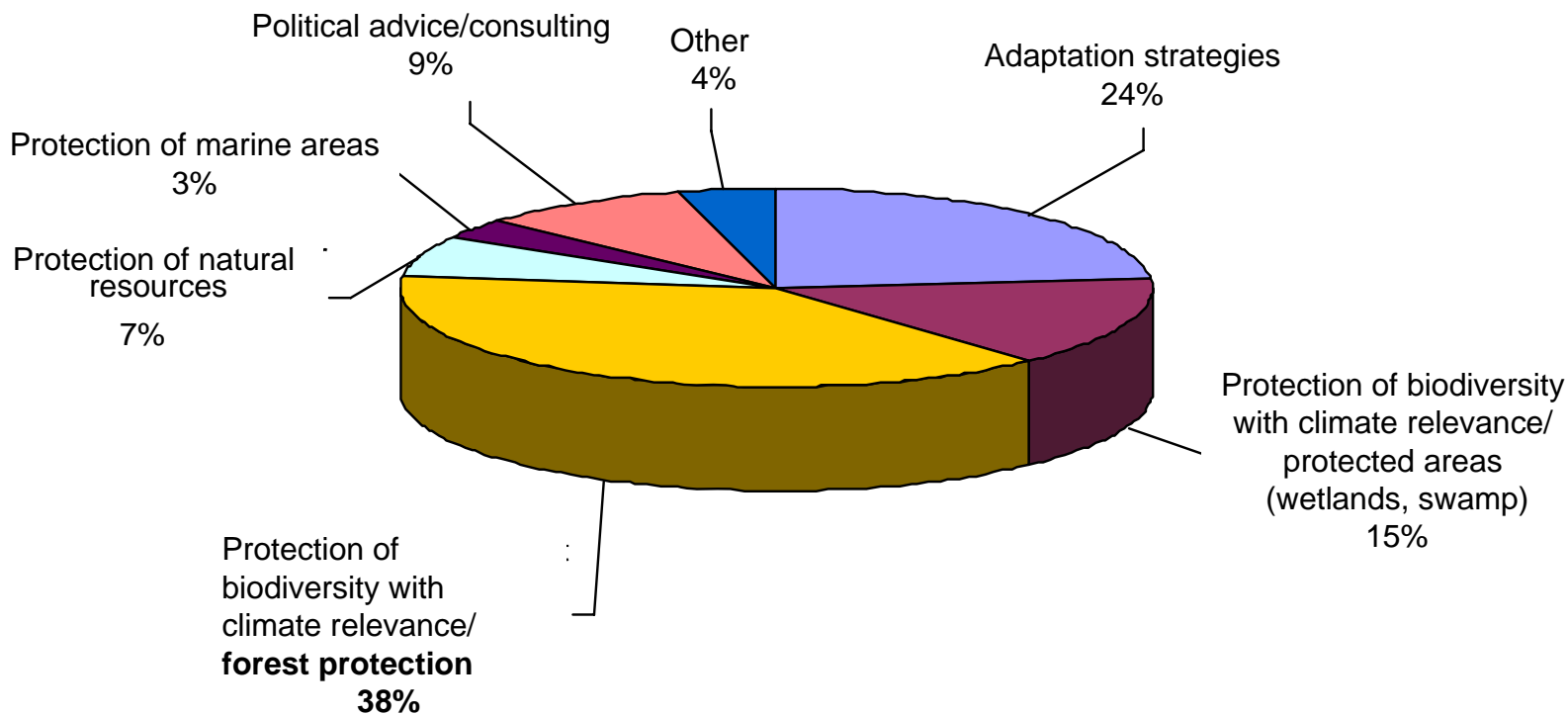
Thematic set-up of the initiative

The initiative builds on two pillars

- **Promotion of sustainable energy supply:**
 - Increase of energy efficiency
 - Increase of renewable energies
 - Reduction of F-gases
- **Adaptation and biodiversity:**
 - Adaptation to climate change impacts
 - Measures to protect biodiversity with climate relevance

About 40 projects are started in 2008
in the following countries:

- Russia, Belarus, Ukraine, Kazakhstan, Turkmenistan, Tadshikistan, Azerbaijan, Southern Caucasus
- Cameroon, DR Congo, Central African Republic. Tanzania, South Africa, Zambia, Madagascar
- Turkey



Implementation of the Climate Protection Initiative

- Project selection is based on a two-staged procedure
 1. Short-listing on the basis of project descriptions
 2. Funding decision on the basis of project application
